About the College

Theme of the Conference

The trends in cross-border displacement of people has gained momentum since the last decade. The displacement has been triggered by wars and conflicts, human rights violation and economic hardships, and may culminate into different forms like migrants, illegal immigrants, refugees, asylum seekers, or stateless people. The migrants and refugees constitute a vulnerable group susceptible to uncertainties of deportation, access to labour market, education and other public goods. The lack of resources available for them are compounded by a myriad of legal, bureaucratic, and administrative challenges. There has been unprecedented migration across the world in the last few years. The Asian region, in particular, has been a volatile region that has witnessed enormous displacements, following the partition of the Indian subcontinent, long drawn wars in Afghanistan, Iraq, Syria, minority exodus from Myanmar, etc. In the backdrop of the present migration scenario and its crucial implications, it is imperative to develop a comprehensive approach for human mobility and enhanced cooperation at the global level.

The objectives of this conference are (i) to trace the trajectory and past trends in migration and consequences of displacements across the world; (ii) to highlight the contemporary crisis, particularly in South and West Asia and its implications; (iii) to examine the economic and social costs of migration on source as well as destination countries; (iv) to evaluate migration and refugee policies of governments and international bodies in resolving the crisis; (v) to explore effective mechanisms in tackling the global problem and (v) to probe the splintered and counter-narratives of migration and displacement in terms of cultural exchanges, linguistic transactions and literary negotiations which engage as narratives of both liberation and imprisonment.

- Gendered migration issues
- Literature probing the position of the citizen and non-state actors in global and regional nationalisms
- Literature of the displaced margins race, gender, class and caste
- Literature interrogating the established migration, exile, memory and diaspora studies
- Migration Representation in music, visual arts, graphic narratives, films and documentaries
- Migration Archives Cartographies, Museums, Preservation and Documentation Narratives
