

CODE OF CONDUCT

1. PREAMBLE

This Handbook indicates the standard procedures and practices of Behala College (hereinafterreferred to as the 'College') for Governing Body/ Teaching Employees/ Non-teaching employees/ Other Staff of the College. All must know that it is incumbent upon them to abide by this Code of Ethics and Conduct (hereinafter referred to as the 'Code') and the rights. All are thus requested to be well aware with this Code.

2. JURISDICTION

The College shall have the jurisdiction over the conduct of all associated with the College and to take notice of all acts of misconduct including incidents of ragging if otherwise takes place in the College Campus or in connection with theCollege related activities and functions.

College may also exercise jurisdiction over conduct which occurs off-campus violating the student conduct and discipline as laid down in this rule, as if the conduct has occurred on campus which shall include:

a) Any violations of the Sexual Harassment
 Policy of the College against other students
 of theInstitute.

- b) Physical assault, threats of violence, or conduct that threatens the health or safety of any person including other students of the College;
- c) Possession or use of weapons, explosives or destructive devices off campus.

d) Manufacture, sale or distribution of prohibited drugs, alcohol etc.

e) Conduct which has a negative impact or constitutes a nuisance to members of the surrounding off-campus community.

CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE FOR STUDENTS

Students seeking admission to College as well asexisting students should give an undertaking countersigned by their parents promising to abide by the guidelines of discipline. Some of the guidelines are as under:

a) He/she shall be regular and must complete his/her studies in the College.

b) In the event, a student is forced to discontinue studies for any legitimate reason; such a student may be relieved from the College, subject to written consent from the Principal. The College under a scholarship, the said grant shall be revoked.

CODE OF CONDUCT

c) As a result of such relieving, the student shall be required to clear pending dues and if a student had joined the College under a scholarship, the said grant shall be revoked.

d) College believes in promoting a safe and efficient climate by enforcing behavioral standards. All students must uphold academic integrity, respect all persons and their rights and property and safety of others; etc.

e) Any act of discrimination (Physical or verbal conduct) based on an individual's gender, caste, race, religion or religious beliefs, colour, region, language, disability, or sexual orientation, marital or family status, physical or mental disability, gender identity, etc.

f) Intentionally damaging or destroying College property or property of other students and/or faculty members.

g) Any disruptive activity in a class room or in an event sponsored by the College.

h) Unable to produce the identity card, issued by the
 College, or refusing to produce it on demand by campus
 security guards.

i) Students are made alert of:

Smoking within the campus of the College is prohibited. Use of mobile phone is prohibited in the College Corridor, and Classroom.

> • Students are expected not to interact, on behalf of the College, with media representatives or invite media persons in the campus without the permission of the College authorities.

- Students are not permitted to either audio or video record lectures in class rooms or actions of other students, faculty or staff without prior permission.
- Students are not permitted to provide audio and video clippings of any activity on the campus to media without prior permission
- Students are expected to use the social media carefully and responsibly. They cannot post derogatory comments about other individuals of the College on social media platforms or indulge in any such related activities having grave ramifications on the reputation of the College.

• Theft, Damage to or destruction of any property of the Institute or any property of others on the College premises.

• Students are advised to wear dresses as instructed on the day of orientation.

If there is case against a student for a possible breach of code of conduct, then disciplinary committee will discuss the matter to recommend a suitable disciplinary action that shall inquire into the alleged violation and accordingly suggest the action to be taken against the said student.



















Candidates included in General Merit List will not be counted towards reserved seats.

An SC/ST candidate will be eligible to fill up application form for admission if the candidate obtains minimum qualifying grade/marks for admission as per C.U norms.

• The College will not be responsible on account of cancellation of Admission due to suppression or misstatement of facts by students at the time of admission. College shall not also be held responsible for cancellation of admission for any reason whatsoever.

Parent-Teacher Meeting

Regular Parent Teacher meetings are held to discuss about students progression in academic issues along with their attendance. Either of the parents who are signatories during admission must attend such meetings and no other relatives will be allowed to participate in such meetings.

Class attendance

A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfilment of other conditions laid down in Regulations.

A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations provided he or she attends a workshop/ remedial class as scheduled by the Institution.

A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he/she has to take admission to the same Semester very next year, for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.

*Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is earlier.

Class Hours

Classes of the college are held from 10:00 am to 5:15 p.m. during Monday to Friday and from 10:00Aa.m to 4:15 p.m. on Saturday.

Payment of Tuition Fees

Tuition fees are payable Online within stipulated time as notified by college.

Notice Board

Each and every student must consult the General notice board and also The Departmental Notice Boards regularly. The college will not take any responsibility, if any student fails to observe any important notice.

Exemption for Differently Abled Students

All differently abled students will be exempted from C.U exam related fees.

Change of Address

Change of address must immediately be communicated to the College Office in writing by the student concerned.

Internship and Exit

All students are required to do one 3 Credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6th Semester.

- Students completing Internship at the end of 2nd Semester will be allowed to take exit from the Course and will be awarded Certificate of 45 (42+3) Credits.
- Students completing Internship at the end of 4th Semester will be allowed to take exit from the Course and will be awarded Diploma of 88 (85+3) Credits.

Students completing Internship at the end of 6th Semester and after successful completion of all the 6 Semesters will be awarded B.A/B.Sc. Degree of 132 (129+3) or 128 (125+3) Credits.

Transfer/Withdrawal Certificate

A student may apply to the Principal for Transfer /Withdrawal certificate in his/her favour. Application for Transfer/ Withdrawal must be signed both by the student and his/her father or legal guardian . All college fees up to the current month and the requisite transfer/ withdrawal fee must be paid before such certificate is issued.

Students seeking transfer withdrawal in the middle of a session are required to pay all annual charges in full in addition to the transfer fee. They must also obtain a clearance certificate beforehand from the Librarian and also from the laboratory for laboratory-based departments.

Discipline


TEACHER QUALITY


Past Performance






